Honorable Members of the School Reform Commission,

On behalf of more than 60 Philadelphia Charter Schools, we want to express our opposition to the amended Policy 406, the Charter Amendment Policy. We seek reasonable and fair charter renewal agreements and amendment policies that reflect the best practices of charter school authorizing. We are requesting that you, the SRC:

- 1. Table Policy 406 and form a working group to collaborate with the charter community to draft a reasonable and updated amendment policy.
- 2. Instruct the Charter Schools Office to negotiate fair charter renewal agreements for the 17 schools currently operating without agreements by March 1, 2018.

There is no urgent need to pass Policy 406. The District has a current policy in place that is adequate. Since there has been some confusion, we want to clarify that no court has mandated that the District must revise its charter amendment policy.

As the District transitions to local control, this is a time for us to be united, not divided – both in Philadelphia and in Harrisburg. Pushing forward with a controversial new amendment policy will only serve to drive a greater wedge between the Charter Schools and the Charter School Office, and set up a lengthy and contentious policy (and likely legal battle) that will last beyond the SRC's existence.

Since the issue appeared before the SRC's Policy Committee we have repeatedly expressed a willingness to work hand-in-hand to develop a new charter amendment process. Yet Policy 406 is not reflective of the input, stakeholder testimony, feedback, or suggested changes that we have offered. On December 7, 2017, over 40 Charter Schools were represented at the Policy Committee meeting, and we were encouraged that the policy was tabled for greater discussion and collaboration. Unfortunately, that opportunity to collaborate never materialized. We were disappointed when our request for a meeting was denied, and frustrated that we received no response from the SRC on the sample language we provided.

There is no disagreement that having a charter amendment policy is good for the District and for the Charter community. Yet this policy, created hastily with no stakeholder input, usurps charter school independence and innovation, violates PA's Charter School Law and adds additional bureaucracy to charter school oversight. If enacted, Policy 406 will restrict our ability to properly and adequately serve our students.

Charter Schools serve and educate over 70,000 public school students in Philadelphia. The District's recently released School Progress Reports (SPR) show that Philadelphia Charter Schools are outperforming School District of Philadelphia (SDP)-managed schools on each metric:

- o Average **Overall** score **43.8** for Charters; 33.6 for SDP
- o Average **Achievement** Score **18.8** for Charters; 18 for SDP
- o Average **Progress** score **52.7** for Charters; 42 for SDP
- o Average Climate score 58.9 for Charters; 39.9 for SDP

Today we are asking the SRC to table Policy 406 until issues surrounding charter renewal agreements are resolved and a working group can be formed to work collaboratively on an updated charter amendment policy.

Thank you for your consideration of our request and know that we stand ready to work together.
