The Governor focuses on "equity" in how districts and charters are treated and funded.

We agree that there is a serious equity issue, but we believe the system disproportionally benefits school districts:

- •The average revenue* per-student at a traditional public school was \$17,531 and \$14,878 at a public charter school.
- •Charter schools educate 7.384% of all students in the Commonwealth and receive 6.34% of the revenue.
- •Traditional school districts spend an average of \$16,434 for each student enrolled. The average payment (Regular and Special Education) for a traditional school district to a public charter school is \$13,241 per student.
- •The average traditional school district's student population is 33.0% economically disadvantaged (ED) but this percentage is 49.7% for cyber charter schools and 66.6% for brick-and-mortar charter schools.
