



- List areas where improvements have been made (multi-hazards plans; removal of trees/vegetation; signage; locking mechanisms; etc.) with accompanying explanations.
- List areas that are priorities for improvement - Known weaknesses and vulnerabilities that should not wait for improvement (i.e.: broken PA system; emergency trainings; propped doors, etc.) with explanations. In this section, also include a brief statement/summary on the **Safe School Report** (PDE PIMS Report that counts how many of each type of infractions occur) and **Safe2Say Something** program (new security tip line initiative by the Attorney General's office).
- Identify short-term goals for improvement in various categories with accompanying explanations (short-term examples: Have a risk & vulnerability assessment conducted; install blinds on classroom door windows; assemble Go-Bags for each classroom; update the public-address system, etc).
- Identify long-term goals in various categories (examples: reconstruct main entrance; purchase additional CCTV cameras; install ballistic film on first floor windows; replace classroom locks; school climate/SAP training, etc).
- Identify the status of Act 44 and other safety & security grants for which the school applied.
- Complete the report with a summary paragraph and several examples of both positive & negative incidents that occurred throughout the school year and how safety & security protocols influenced these incidents.
- Include a brief statement/summary of the **Safe School Report** and the **Safe2Say Something Program** (high level overview).
